Here is the scenario:

I logged 5 hours against issue MMAEA-1. I then went in to split the time. As discussed, you don't get the option to select 'Account' on the time splitting screen. So the assumption we were making was that when I picked an issue to split the time with, the system would inherit the account associated with the other issue. In this example, I selected a task on a completely different project, which I also have access to, but which is not affiliated with this account. The time gets split out on the timesheet but is associated with the first account even though that other issue (EPTF-2) is not associated with a project linked to that account.

Interestingly, if on that same row on the timesheet I try to enter time on another day for that same issue (EPTF-2, which is not associated with the first account), the system won't let me pick the wrong account. That's the behavior I was expecting based on my understanding of how the project/account relationship works.

See how it's reflected on the timesheet? In a standalone scenario, the system knows that EPTF-2 cannot be associated with the first account. It just didn't take that into account when splitting the time.
